Pledge Collateral is at \$1,525,000.00, and \$250,000.00 FDIC insured.

Sheriff's April Miscellaneous Fee Report was reviewed and put-on file.

NIRMA: deductible for 2022-2023. After discussion last week and following up with NIRMA this week, discussion of leaving the deductible at \$1,000.00. Motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to approved NIRMA deductible and 2022-2023 rates. Voting aye: Smith, Krebs, Jacob, Pedersen and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.

Storage Shed - Antelope County Law Enforcement: Sheriff Moore has submitted three (3) like bids for a 10 x 10, wooden floor storage shed on skids. The bids ranging from \$5,500.00 - \$6,500.00. The low bid has a build date of 2022. The other two (2) have a build date of 2023. Motion by Commissioner Pedersen, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to accept the apparent low bid from Ron Beckman of \$5,500.00. Voting aye: Pedersen, Krebs, Jacob and Henery. Nays Smith. Motion carried.

Cafeteria/125 Plan: discussion of possible changes to the deductible and major medical insurance it was tabled until the June 21st, 2022 meeting. No further action.

Zoning Administrator Report: Wingate met with the Commissioners.

- During discussions over the last month regarding update of Zoning Regulations and grants it was determined ARPA Funds could be utilized in the expense. Megan asked for motion regarding same. Motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to utilize part of the ARPA Funds on Planning and Zoning updates. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Krebs, Pedersen and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- Administrative Plat postponed for paperwork.
- No further report.

Veterans Service Officer: Tom Nelson met with the Commissioners for an update on office. In the past 12 months, there have been 24 flags placed. Currently, Tom is serving 594 Veterans which is up approximately 20 veterans. Over \$4,552,000.00 veterans benefits and healthcare for Antelope County Veterans. Roughly 327 office visits in 2021-2022. Nelson is worrying about the current economy regarding future benefits. The Commissioners thanked Mr. Nelson for his service and help.

Millings: Oakdale Village has requested to use some of the ground milling being stored in Oakdale. A long discussion regarding pros and cons, availability for every town and village. Oakdale has requested up to and exceeding 20 loads. Antelope County does not have an immediate need for the millings, but it was earmarked for road projects. The Commissioners all stated they wanted to be neighborly, but the county has a use for the millings. The amount being requested is a great amount. After discussion regarding requestor and Oakdale Village Board, it was decided not to sell millings at this time.

Road Superintendent Report:

- Underground Permit: Great Plains Aaron asked to hold until the 28th. He has not connected with Great Plains as of now.
- Access Permit: Gary Yoder submitted an access permit for a house access on 517th Avenue in the SW1/4 of Section 5, Township 27 North, Range 6, West of the 6th PM, Antelope County, Nebraska. Aaron voiced this could be approved as long as Mr. Yoder builds a house. Without a resident being build it does not qualify as access ready. Motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve access pending house build. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Krebs, Pedersen and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- Oversize Permit: RMS submitted a permit to move a crane from Tower 201 to Highway 45. Aaron voiced no issues and believes this has been mobilized already. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to approve oversize permit. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Krebs, Pedersen, and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- Old Highway 14: Boggs is still hoping to limit some of the heavy traffic on Old Highway 14. The stretch up there gets used as a cut across for some of the heavy trucks and semis and it is very hard on the surface of the road. Motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to draft resolution to limit traffic on Old Highway 14 going north of Neligh to 'no through truck traffic'. Voting aye: Smith, Krebs, Pedersen and Henery. Nays Jacob. Motion passed.
- Storm Shelters: Last week it was discussed that six (6) of the existing barns do not currently have storm refuge areas. Boggs has found in-ground storm shelters. Current quote is for \$3,450.00 each. Commissioner Henery mentioned he has a used in-ground storm shelter exactly like the quoted ones he is selling for \$2,500.00. Boggs stated he could not locate any vendors selling like products in the Midwest area. It was unanimously agreed storm shelters are needed in all of the barn locations. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to approve shelter purchase, and the used one from Mr. Henery, and five (5) from Divine Concrete, Inc. Voting aye: Pedersen, Jacob, Krebs, Smith. Abstain Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- Tack Trailer: Boggs presented a quote for a Leeboy L600T Tack Trailer -600-gallon capacity, diesel burner, electric start 12' spray bar with in cab controls, overnight heater for \$33,090.00. Trade-in 2008 Rosco RA-300 GMC Chassis for \$12,500.00. Bringing total purchase price to \$18,090.00. Discussion regarding value of patcher is basically non-existant without the trade. The tack trailer would be utilized in overlays and armor coating. Boggs also presented rental contracts for renting tack trailer. With signed purchase agreement Rose equipment will rent tack trailer to Antelope County for \$3,375.00 for three (3) months. Motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve purchase of tack trailer and rental for 3 months. Voting aye: Smith, Krebs, Jacob, Pedersen and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- ROW Maintenance Boggs believes the culvert discussed last week was actually punctured. He will replace the culvert, keep the Commissioners posted. Boggs stated mowing may need to be discussed.
- Escrow Fund short discussion. It is back on the agenda for 28th day of June.

NextLink: Bill Baker, CEO from Next Link, headquartered in Texas, met with Commissioners via Zoom. He reviewed the project and plan to upgrade the unserved and underserved internet areas in Antelope County. Currently, NextLink has 10 active towers in Antelope County. They want to meet Antelope County's need and work with their desires. Mr. Baker offered to put a plan together to present for linking the towers to expand service.

NCDHD: Commissioner Smith will talk with Diane Carlin, from Antelope Memorial Hospital. Clerk will send minutes from the 2022 appointment to NCDHD.

Motion carried. Chairman Henery stated no action was taken during executive session.

No other issues to discuss.
