August 5th, 2025 Antelope County Board of Commissioners Neligh, Nebraska

The Antelope County Board of Commissioners convened in regular session on Tuesday, August 5th, 2025, at 9:00 AM in the County Commissioners Meeting Room, Antelope County Courthouse Annex, Neligh, Nebraska. The meeting was called to order by the Chairperson, Henery, with the following board members in attendance: Dittrich, Krebs, Jacob and Henery. Williby was absent. The Chairperson stated that the open meeting laws are posted on the east wall of the Commissioner's Meeting Room with more copies available at the County Clerk's Office.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the three (3) county newspapers, legal newspapers printed and in general circulation in Antelope County, Nebraska as shown by proof of publication filed in the County Clerk's office. The agenda for said meeting was sent to all members of the County Board of Commissioners.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Agenda: Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Dittrich to approve the agenda as presented. Voting aye: Dittrich, Krebs, Jacob, and Henery. Nays none. Williby was absent. Motion carried.

Minutes: Minutes of July 8th, 2025, Board of Commissioner Meeting. Clerk was notified of some changes, updated minutes were sent last night. Commissioners did not have time to review changes. Item to be placed back on the agenda for next week. No action today.

Minutes: Minutes of July 22nd, 2025, Board of Equalization Meeting. Commissioners did not have a quorum to approve minutes they will be placed on next week's agenda. No action today.

9:05 AM: Public Comment: Chairman Henery called for any public comments three (3) times. No comments were voiced.

Zoning Administrator Report: Mrs. Wingate met with the Commissioners.

- Administrative Plat: Jesse McKillip presents an administrative plat. He intends to purchase the surveyed 5.017 Acre tract in the SW corner of the SW¼ of Section 28, Township 25, Range 7, West of the 6th P.M., Antelope County, Nebraska. His parents currently own the parent parcel. Mrs. Wingate states this parcel meets all setbacks and has no issues. Jesse plans to build a home on the property. Access permit is on the agenda for today. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve administrative plat and authorize Chairman to sign same. Voting aye: Krebs, Dittrich, Jacob, and Henery. Nays none. Williby was absent. Motion carried.





Antelope Country Club - Liquor License: Advertisement was placed as required. No written or verbal correspondence has been received by the Clerk. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Dittrich to approve and accept the liquor license renewal for Antelope Country Club for the 2025-2026 year. Voting aye: Krebs, Dittrich, Jacob, and Henery. Nays none. Williby was absent. Motion carried.

Miles of Smiles: The Annual Report was shared. Discussion. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to approve participation in the program for the 2025-2026 fiscal year. Voting aye: Dittrich, Jacob, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Williby was absent. Motion passed.

Assessor's Cemetery List and Three (3) year Assessment Practice: By state statute the Assessor is to report the Assessment three (3) year plan and the annual cemetery list. Today, Kelly Mueller, Antelope County Assessor, presents both plans to the Commissioners. Discussion. No action.

Subdivision Levy Authority: Subdivision Levy's. Discussion. All levies appear to be within limits of the County Lid. The County Attorney had not reviewed the resolution. Item will be on next week's agenda.


Postage Meter- Lease Renewal – Antelope County currently leases a postage machine and meter from Pitney Bowes. The Lease agreement is up this fall. Price comparison between Pitney Bowes and Quadient. Both offered very similar products. Quadient quoted a five (5) year lease at \$369.90 a month, and Pitney Bowes quoted a five (5) year lease at \$354.42 a month. Discussion. Cost savings – although small would lean towards Pitney Bowes. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve and authorize Chairman to sign Pitney Bowes agreement for five (5) year lease (60 months) at \$354.42 billed quarterly at \$1,063.26. Voting aye: Dittrich, Jacob, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Williby was absent. Motion passed.

One- and Six-Year Road Plan: Brian McDonald, Highway Superintendent met with the Commissioners to review the One and Six-Year Road Plan from last year. The County made great strides in getting projects completed. A good share of the one-year projects were completed during the 2024-2025 fiscal year. Today, he presents with discussion of 'new' projects to add to the plan. Discussion. The Commissioners and Road Superintendent are asked to review and add possible projects for the 2025-2026 One- and Six-Year Road Plan. Discussions of listed projects, additional projects and/or plans and thoughts of probably/possible projects. A bridge in northwest corner of the County could possibly be added, to make access more available. At this time, to get around you must go through Knox and Holt County. Hard surfacing of 516th going north out of Clearwater was discussed. The hearing will be held in October, when the final plan will be presented and approved. The list is presented today to allow enough time for thoughts and discussions in the planned work and projects. Mr. McDonald will meet with the Commissioners in September to set a hearing date (probably in October) for adoption of the One- and Six-Year Road Plan. No further action today.

Project C-2 392: Brian McDonald, Highway Superintendent requested the appointment of Leigh Kluthe, Road Superintendent to negotiate the right of way with adjoining landowners. This project is around 523rd Avenue and 841st Road. The plan is to reconstruct the area for site distance, including straightening of the road. Commissioner Dittrich offered to assist Mr. Kluthe in the right-of-way access process. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve and authorize Mr. Kluthe to work with adjoining landowners in the securing of project and road right of way as needed. Voting aye: Dittrich, Jacob, Krebs, and Henery. Nays none. Williby absent. Motion passed.

Bridge Inspections and Files: Mr. McDonald reports there is a bridge file inspection audit in the works. JEO is working on the bridge inspections. Fracture critical bridge inspections are due in the near future.

Highway Superintendent: Nebraska Board of Public Roads Classifications and Standards Annual Certification of Program Compliance: Antelope County is required to file annually the Certification to qualify for federal highway funds. This form insures that the County has a Highway Superintendent on payroll and the additional guidelines are being meet state and federal compliance. Resolution and program compliance. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve Program Compliance for the 2025 fiscal year and authorize chairman to sign. Voting aye: Dittrich, Krebs, Jacob and Henery. Nays none. Williby was absent. Motion carried.



Turning Radius: Matt Klabenes submitted some temporary road crossings to establish radius turns on two (2) intersections. We believe there to be a plan to move many blades in and out as they continue to change and update blades on the current wind farms. Brian McDonald, Highway Superintendent, was asked about this. Anytime someone is changing the roadway or surface the County is responsible. If such action is to take place Mr. McDonald believes a construction plan should be submitted, a bond and certificate of liability should be in hand before any work is started. It should remain in place throughout the duration of the planned project. Discussion. Mr. Klabenes and Teresa Fulcher (from Invenergy) will be at next week's meeting for follow-up and discussion. Discussion of referring to the original Road Use Agreement, so roads included in the original agreement can be utilized for future and continued wind turbine construction and maintenance.

• Discussion about having a permit for this scenario. Discussion to continue next week.

2 Track Road – privately being changed/improved: Brian McDonald was asked about a private landowner changing a 2-track road into a road surface. The landowner has not been identified, however major 'work' has been completed on three (3)+/- miles of road: 853rd Road between 521st & 522nd Avenue; 522nd Avenue between 853rd and 853.5 Road, and 520th Avenue between 857th & 858th Road. Brian McDonald believes this is a legal issue, and law enforcement and the County Attorney probably should be involved, as the County is liable for standards regarding roads and upgrades. There are standards on road improvement that need to be met when changes are taking place. Again, in this situation, there was no plan/permission, no bond and no certificate of liability.

CAT Refurbishing of the 140 G's and 140 H's: Dave Prauner, CAT representative, presented two (2) estimates for refurbishing old graders. Discussion. No action today.

Contractor's Change Order No One (1): North Construction LLC – Construction manager for the Elgin East Culvert project change order was presented for change order quantities totaling \$-3,567.50. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve and authorize Chairman to sign change order application. Voting aye: Dittrich, Jacob, Krebs, and Henery. Nays none. Williby absent. Motion passed.

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Contractor's Certificate of Substantial Completion: North Construction LLC – Construction manager for the Elgin East Culvert project certificate of substantial completion was presented. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve and authorize Chairman to sign substantial completion certificate. Voting aye: Dittrich, Jacob, Krebs, and Henery. Nays none. Williby was absent. Motion passed.



Contractor's Application for Payment: North Construction LLC – Construction manager for the Elgin East Culvert project pay application was presented for payment of \$42,242.16. Motion by Commissioner Krebs, seconded by Commissioner Dittrich to approve and authorize Chairman to sign pay application. Application will be coded for payment next week. Voting aye: Dittrich, Jacob, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Williby was absent. Motion passed.



Dispatch Radio Counsel Bid Opening: Project was advertised as required by statute. Today, we are in receipt of a single bid from Shaffer Communications. This bid is for \$97,268.76. Sheriff Robert Moore said he had received calls inquiring, and all were asked to come look at the current setup as the plan was to have the 'new' system complement the Dispatch Center/Communications Center current setup. Discussion. Installation will probably be fall of 2025. Sheriff Moore reports the 9-1-1 Board plans to pay \$30,000.00 of this bill. Motion by Commissioner Krebs, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve and accept the bid submitted by Shaffer Communications for \$97,268.76. Voting aye: Dittrich, Jacob, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Williby was absent. Motion passed.

11:04 AM: Commissioner Jacob left the meeting.

Law Enforcement Center Repairs: Sheriff reports he has had some leaking in the Law Enforcement Center building. The contractor who built the building has looked at the leaks. He believes somewhere (or sometime) the building was hit by a lawn mower, or some piece of equipment, cracking the cast cement wall and breaking the seal. It probably was done in the past (maybe a year or two), and with the moisture this summer is presenting itself. Discussion. The Commissioners agreed the building needed to be fixed. The contractor gave Sheriff the name of a company who specializes in these repairs. Sheriff was instructed to proceed with fixes.

• Sheriff Moore stated there are cracks in his parking lot. He is worried about all the moisture in the ground freezing and heaving the cement. He has contacted a contractor regarding this. No objection was voiced.

Pickup Boxes: Antelope County Weed Department: The weed department is currently housing two pickup boxes, tailgates and bumpers.

Discussion on these pickup parts. There is not a high value to these items, and it is believed the area in the Weed Department Shop where these are stored could be utilized by the Sheriff for lawn mowers, bobcat, etc. Currently, the sheriff's office houses lawn and snow removal equipment outside behind the Law Enforcement Center. There is a bit of value in this equipment sitting outside. Discussion. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to authorize the clerk to advertise the items for sale in the paper, on the website and on Facebook. Voting aye: Dittrich, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Williby and Jacob were absent. Motion passed.

District Seven Probation Year End Review and Budget Request of 2025-2026: The budget for Probation District Seven was presented. Short discussion. No action.

Distress Warrants: Antelope County Sheriff, Robert Moore presented the report on the distress warrants. All distress warrants have been collected except for two (2) in bankruptcy as detailed in the Sheriff Report. The Treasure's letter affirming the report was reviewed and filed. No action.

Maintenance Issues: Prairie View Roofing completed the roofing of the 'old' courthouse. There has been little water in the basement since. The Clerk reported the roof of the single-story jet out was not roofed during the roofing of the old courthouse. She has been in contact with Prairie View Roofing, and they will come out and complete that for \$1,800-3,600.00. The Clerk reports tuck pointing at the old courthouse might be in order soon. The stairs on the back and front of the old courthouse need repair and carpet. The basement entrance (in the parking lot) needs repair, as long as the door. Painting of the cornice area of the old courthouse is needed to complete the aesthetics of the old courthouse. The clerk has been in contact with some local contractors for small repairs. She will continue to work with them.

Maintenance Position: With the above discussion, and several other factors, discussion of possibly hiring a maintenance position. Hiring a custodian/maintenance/janitorial position, in which the right person will wear many hats. A job description (from Madison County) was shared. There are many 'jobs' 'duties' not getting done. The maintenance position could be complementary to the lawn mowing and snow removal. Discussion. The Commissioners will have to continue to visit.

Road Superintendent Report:

- Temporary Road Crossings: Mr. Matthew Klabenes submitted two (2) temporary road crossings for radius turns for blades coming and going from the Antelope County wind farms. 841st Road & 514th Avenue and Highway 14 (going north on east side) and 841st (Road west side). He was not present today. Brian McDonald highway Superintendent, requested the County have a project plan, proof of insurance and a bond in place before contractor is allowed to construct in or along the County Road or road surface. In correspondence by phone with Mr. Klabenes he expects the radius turns to be deconstructed as early as the 13th of August. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to give a temporary approval as they are in place now and the plan is to remove them next week. Voting aye: Krebs, Dittrich and Henrry. Nays none. Jacob and Williby were absent. Motion passed.
- Oversize Permit: (205) Oversize Permit submitted by Midwest Infrastructure: North on 519th Avenue from Highway 20 to 865th Road. Road Superintendent voiced no concerns, and the move has been completed. No issues were encountered. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to approve oversize permits. Voting aye: Krebs, Dittrich and Henrry. Nays none. Jacob and Williby were absent. Motion passed.

Voting aye: Krebs, Dittrich and Henrry. Nays none. Jacob and Williby were absent. Motion passed.

Road Superintendent voiced no concerns, and the move has been completed. No issues were encountered. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to approve oversize permits. Voting aye: Krebs, Dittrich and Henrry. Nays none. Jacob and Williby were absent. Motion passed.

Voting aye: Krebs, Dittrich and Henrry. Nays none. Williby and Jacob were absent. Motion passed.
- Oversize Permit (218-219, 220-221, 222-223 6 total = 3 in/out): Permit submitted by Nomad. Bach Farms Custom LLC 218-219; Bach Trucking LLC 220-221; CM Transport LLC 222-223. Route: Upstream Tower 42 530th Avenue to 852nd Road-Highway 14 to Highway 70 to 514th Avenue to Thunderhead Tower 48. Road Superintendent voiced no concerns, and the move has been completed. No issues were encountered. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to approve oversize permits. Voting aye: Krebs, Dittrich and Henrry. Nays none. Williby and Jacob were absent. Motion passed.
- Right of Way Permit: R-O-W Permits: (underground-2) Mid States Data Transport/Stealth. Bauer Underground will be doing the work. Mr. Kluthe and Mr. Jones have verified the route and all right of way junctions. Mr. Kluthe reports no issues. Motion by Commissioner Krebs, seconded by Commissioner Dittrich to approve underground permits per Road Superintendent recommendation. Voting aye: Dittrich, Krebs, and Henrry. Nays none. Williby and Jacob were absent Motion passed.
- Right of Way Permit: R-O-W Permits: (underground) Village of Orchard. Work to be completed by Village and County personnel and in accordance with state and county recommendations. Fill in drainage ditch to provide a safer roadway and keep from cleaning out ditch every year after snow removal. Mr. Kluthe and Mr. Jones have verified the crossing. Mr. Kluthe reports no issues. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to approve right of way permit per Road Superintendent recommendation. Voting aye: Dittrich, Krebs, and Henrry. Nays none. Williby and Jacob were absent Motion passed.
- Access Permit: Jesse McKillip submitted an access permit for 847th Road, located in the SW Corner of SE½ Section 28, Township 27, Range 7, West of the 6th P.M., Antelope County, Nebraska. Road Superintendent reports it will be 30-40' width, no culvert needed, no issues. Today, the Administrative Plat was approved for the parcel. Motion by Commissioner Dittrich, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to approve access permit. Voting aye: Dittrich, Krebs, and Henrry. Nays none. Williby and Jacob were absent Motion passed.
- Farmers Pride Propane Contract. The Commissioners are not interested today.
- Royal North Culvert Mr. Kluthe reports culvert was purchased last week for \$20,900.00. 120" arch 142 x 91, B's Enterprises. He received bids from B's, Ace, and Midwest Service and Sales.
- **865**th **Road between 518**th **and 516**th **Avenue** (east of Ahlers Dairy): 3 60" arch culverts. Cheapest bid \$10,018.00 each, B's Enterprises. He received bids from B's, Ace, and Midwest Service and Sales.
- Trucks with Plows: Mr. Kluthe and Mr. Jones have been searching for trucks with plows to use for snow removal. Today they share sale notices of two (2) trucks.

 - 2006 International Workstar 7400 Plow Truck Spreader Truck \$35,900 Oak Creek
 Discussion. Mr. Kluthe was authorized to continue to 'shop' and work with the dealers on purchase, and to report back to
 Commissioners. Mr. Kluthe is hoping for a one trip to shop, purchase and pay. Mr. Kluthe will ask a mechanic to go with him for
 review and evaluation. He will work with the dealers as needed. The use of the truck and plow was discussed, the Commissioners

agreed this could be a quicker/faster option compared to a grader.

- 513th Avenue Asphalt project is complete.
- Copenhagen Road north of VanKirk's possible culvert. Probably will be replaced this fall.
- Cold Mix: Focus for August: 2 miles west of Tilden, 1 mile of Sargent Irrigation (3rd mile in), north of Tilden (south of Rutjens new house to bottom of hill)
- Full Depth Reclamation: east of Neligh hoping for a fall 2025 project.

Budget: Quick discussion regarding next week's budget discussion. No action taken.

Adjournment: Motion was made by Commissioner Dittrich seconded by Commissioner Krebs to **adjourn**. Voting aye: Dittrich, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Williby and Jacob were absent. Motion passed.
