The 2017 Audit was discussed during the March 7th, 2017 meeting. After corresponding with Deann Heaffner of the State Auditor's Office it was discussed the Audit service was a professional service, and would be excluded from the bid process. Motion by Commissioner Schindler, seconded by Commissioner Schwager to contract with the State Auditor's Office to complete the 2017 Audit. Voting aye: Schindler, Schwager, Henery, Jacob and Kerkman. Nays none. Motion carried.

Road Boss Report: Casey Dittrich gave a brief report, and presented a Pallet Striper brochure. The piece of equipment was a Model AL120-EZ Pallet Striper the unit has a base price of \$40,000.00 and to set it up to be utilized correctly is an additional \$12,000.00; for a total of approximately \$52,000.00. Because the striping of roads has been brought up a number of times during the business meeting, he wanted to look into the cost and present to the Commissioners for discussion. It takes two (2) people to run it. It is lifted with a pallet fork and sets in the back of a pickup. \$800.00 per mile to stripe one (1) mile. Brian McDonald would have to come out and do a study on each mile which would cost approximately \$ 150.00. The Orchard Road would cost approximately \$ 8,300.00. McDonald said most of the roads could be center striped, not dotted because that would indicate a passing lane and the county would be holding the bag if someone passes and it is not properly striped. There is little liability not having the roads striped. Discussion continued regarding the use and need of the striping machine. It was decided to table discussion, and complete more research as to the useful and effectiveness of the machine overall. Semi – tractor bids to be opened at 10:00 AM today. Casey reminded the Commissioners regarding the publishing/advertising of bid letting gravel/asphalt/oil for the 2017 season, for opening during the 2nd meeting in March (14th). Hiring an employee for the Road and Bridge Department. We are down two (2) full time positions at this time. We advertised for help, and left the opening very broad because we could hire a person for part-time busy work, and did not attach it to a barn. We are accepting applications until next week. It is not necessary at this time, as all in all the weather forecast looks to be very favorable conditions. Currently he is searching for a patching machine driver, as the employee doing the patching recently transferred to the Neligh Barn, to run the new CAT Grater.

Driveway site a resolution/policy is currently being written up, it is not complete. Will be ready for next meeting. Motion by Commissioner Henery, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to adopt policy and implement the policy to mandate the Permit to utilize road access with a \$20.00 permit fee, to be filed with the Clerk's Office with all permits. The road boss will sign off on all permits after site study complete and passable, and then they will be an agenda item to be approved by the Commissioners during a board meeting. Voting aye: Henery, Jacob, Schindler, Schwager and Kerkman. Nays none. Motion carried.

ANTELOPE COUNTY ROAD ACCESS PERMIT RESOLUTION 2017-02-000

WHEREAS the Antelope County Board of Commissioner has received evidence that the public access of Antelope County Residents is needed to accommodate new or existing permanent or temporary rural locations in Antelope County,

WHEREAS these accesses can be hazardous, and not in the best interest of the county, or its population, and may provide a danger to motorists if not site specific and may cause hazards that endanger motorists, County employees, County equipment, and interfere with the proper maintenance of the roadway, especially during snow removal operations if not properly sited.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Antelope County shall, exercise its right to locate, map, verify and permit these right of way accesses to site specific locations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Antelope County Commissioners established a written policy and permit application for the formation and dedication of site right of way access as deemed necessary by the Antelope County Road Boss, Highway Superintendent, County Commissioners and Zoning Administrator,

AND, these applications for permits shall be on file at the clerk's office, the proper fee collected and recorded by the County Clerk's Office. After the permit application is filed, and before it is discussed during open session, the assigned Antelope County Personnel will inspect and sign off the site-specific address; a copy of aforementioned permit is attached;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Antelope County Clerk shall collect a fee of \$20.00 for each permit application. This permit application fee must be paid and the permit application shall be filed with the Antelope County Clerk's Office no less than 48 hours prior to the regularly scheduled Commissioner Meeting, in order for it to be placed on the agenda.

Audio Visual Equipment request for the meeting room was discussed with Mr. Bill Rahder of Boyd's Network Solutions. He will work on providing this service. He expects the cost around \$2,000.00.

James Daubert with First Concord Benefits met with the Commissioners regarding the cash in lieu payment for insurance benefits. This program works with individuals who are able to carry Medicare, but at this time are still active with the counties BC/BS. The option of "in-lieu-of" insurance payments would be an amount that would reimburse the participants who opted to go with Medicare instead of the county insurance carrier. The 'in-lieu of' would reimburse the individual for supplemental premium, Medicare deductibles, and Coinsurance. As an example, First Concord Benefits has worked up a scenario where the in lieu of payment would be approximately \$ 350.00-400.00. By utilizing this plan, it becomes a viable option for employees who are eligible for Medicare, and take the buyup. By utilizing the Medicare coverage for these individuals, and paying a cash in lieu we would offset most of the expenses the employee would incur for utilizing the Medicare coverage (i.e. deductible, co-pays, premiums) Senior Option Plan. There are approximately 14 individuals who them or their spouses, or both would be able to utilize the Medicare method. The study conducted by Mr. Daubert regarding eligible Medicare participants and or spouses would save the county approximately \$100.000.00 a year, if all plan participants who were able participated. If this option is utilized it would be at the option of ALL employees. However, the in-lieu-of would only pertain if the individual employee can "prove" equal coverage. Item will be placed back on the agenda for March 7, 2017. Dean Smith requested to look into self-insuring of Antelope County.

Catastrophic Inmate Medical Insurance was discussed with Sheriff Moore and the Commissioners. Currently, Antelope County is insured through Hunt Insurance Group to provide a catastrophic insurance policy for jail inmates. Antelope County is covered with have a \$250,000.00. This plan is up for

renewal and expires March 31, 2017. Sheriff Moore expressed the need for the continuation, and discussed with the Commissioners the possibility of upping the coverage. The commissioners agreed a possible \$500,000.00 limit of coverage might be beneficial, considering the higher medical costs involved in the world today. The commissioners asked Sheriff Moore and the County Clerk to investigate into the cost of upping the limited coverage to a \$500,000.00 per inmate coverage. Item was tabled until further information is gathered. Item will be on March agenda. Call was made to Carey Boucher at Hunt Insurance. She will send to underwriting.

Joshua Framel, Invenergy Manager of Business Development stood up and introduced himself to the commissioners. He recently replaced Emily Kobylarczyk for Invenergy. He just gave a brief update on work, with nothing new to report. Zoning permits, and inspection are complete. They do not have an estimated date for beginning construction on the pending Upstream project.

Motion was made by Commissioner Schindler, seconded by Commissioner Henery to adjourn. Voting aye: Henery, Jacob, Schindler, Schwager and Kerkman. Nays none. Motion passed.
