The Antelope County Board of Commissioners convened in regular session on Tuesday, April 14th, 2020 at 8:02 AM in the Commissioner Meeting Room and via ZOOM Meeting, Antelope County Courthouse, Neligh, NE.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the two (2) county newspapers, legal newspapers printed and in general circulation in Antelope County, Nebraska as shown by proof of publication filed in the County Clerk's Office. Agenda for said meeting was sent to all members of the County Board of Commissioners, and posted on the Antelope County Website with the Zoom Meeting information.

Chairman Henery opened the meeting at 8:00 AM. Responding to Roll Call: Commissioners Smith, Krebs, Pedersen by ZOOM, and Jacob and Henery present. Chairman stated the Open Meetings poster is posted on the east wall of the Commissioner Meeting Room. Additional copies available in the County Clerk's Office.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Chairman Henery stated the meeting is an open meeting and the Courthouse is open, and the meeting can be participated by ZOOM utilizing the Chat system.

Agenda: Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Smith to approve agenda as presented. 862nd Road was a late add on by County Attorney Joe Abler – no action to be taken, information only. Voting aye: Smith, Krebs, Pedersen, Jacob, and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.

Minutes of the **March 3rd, 2020 Board of Commissioners** was presented. Motion by Commissioner Pedersen, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve minutes. Voting aye: Pedersen, Jacob, Krebs, Smith and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.

Clerk of the District Court office matters: Judy Cole, Antelope County Clerk of the District Court submitted a letter of resignation effective June 30th, 2020. No action taken.

Pledge Collateral: Pledge Collateral Imprest account is at \$1,000,000.00, and FDIC insure of \$250,000.00.

NIS Vision Renewal: NACO Vision VSP Plan: VSP has contracted with NACO to slight increase the current premiums for the Vision insurance for three (3) years. (Increase \$0.17 single, \$0.36 ee/sp; \$0.44 ee/children; \$0.59 Family) Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to approve and allow the Chairman to sign the plan agreement. Voting aye: Pedersen, Jacob, Krebs, Smith and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.

Discussion on **May Commissioner Meetings.** Discussion. The 12th of May is Primary Election Day. In respect of the Election, a motion was made by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to move the meeting to Monday, May 11th, 2020, at 8:00 AM. Voting aye: Pedersen, Jacob, Krebs, Smith and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried. Both, meetings, if holding both will be on ZOOM. It was determined later both meetings will be held in May.

Pandemic Disaster Declaration: Discussion on Antelope County declaring a disaster regarding the COVID-19 Corona Virus Pandemic. In order for any part of the County to declare a disaster and potentially file and collect FEMA fees the County has to declare a disaster. Motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve and authorize Chairman to sign declaration. Discussion on verbiage and timeline of declaration. Agreement on the start date as of the end of January, to be signed today as approved by County Attorney. Voting aye: Krebs, Jacob, Pedersen, Smith and Henery nays none. Motion carried.

Keystone XL Pipeline: Art Tanderup met with the Commissioners via ZOOM, regarding the Keystone Pipeline and the project concerns and problems. Including the Aquaphor, EPA regulations, eminent domain, route changes, and more. No action taken.

Zoning Administrator Report: Liz Doerr presented today with two (2) Administrative Plats;

- **Administrative Plat:** Alan Rutjens 4.83 Acres in the NE corner of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, Township 24, Range 5. This split is from parent parcel of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$. Pentagon Investment Lot Split. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to approve lot split as submitted. Voting aye: Pedersen, Jacob, Krebs, Smith and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- **Administrative Plat:** Weston Frahm 6.35 Acres in the NE corner of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 3, Township 27, Range 5. This split is from parent parcel of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$. Frahm Farms Inc. Motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve lot split as submitted. Voting aye: Pedersen, Jacob, Krebs, Smith and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- Ice Sling last week, Liz reported she had heard some concerns regarding ice sling last week. She said every report shared very good information, and Invenergy was able to isolate and shut down appropriate towers. She expressed she thought the protocol was working well.

862nd Road County Attorney, Joe Abler met with the Commissioners in follow-up of 862nd Road. This road was plowed up by a neighboring land owner. There is a statute about misdemeanors when the public is changing county roads. However, it is believed the individual who completed this damage had contacted an individual that could be in a supervisory position. Aaron expressed the concern about individuals messing the County roads. The damage is done, and it will cause the county \$5-10,000.00 and years of time to restore it. Aaron will be running a public notice in the papers regarding same.

Antelope Country Club: 9:44 AM Motion by Commissioner Jacob and seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to open the public hearing for Antelope Country Club liquor license. Hearing was advertised on or about April 1st, 2020. No written or verbal comments were submitted. No one was available to testify. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to approve. Motion was rescinded as we needed to close public hearing. Motion by Commissioner Jacob and seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to close public hearing. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Pedersen, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Jacob and seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to approve liquor license for Antelope Country Club. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Pedersen, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.

Road Superintendent Report

- **Underground Permit:** The application for underground permit submitted by **Josh Schindler** to place a 2-inch pipe underneath 516th Avenue in the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 36, Township 24, Range 8 West of the 6th PM. Board of Education Lands and Funds is owner and Josh Schindler is tenant. The pipe will be used to carry water to get water to livestock. No

contractor was listed. Motion by Commission Pedersen, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve application for underground permit to cross 516th Avenue. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Pedersen, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.

- **Underground Permit:** The application for underground permit submitted by **Boyd Pedersen** to place a 2-inch pipe underneath 529th Avenue in the SE¼ Section 18, Township 27, Range 5 to SW¼ Section 17, Township 27, Range 5 West of the 6th PM. Roland Pudenz is owner. The pipe will provide electricity to well and pivot. Boyd's Electrical Services, Inc. is contractor. Motion by Commission Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to approve application for underground permit to cross 529th Avenue. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Pedersen abstained. Motion carried.
- **Underground Permit:** The application for underground permit submitted by **Terry Anson** to place a 2.5-inch pipe underneath 861st Road in the NE¼ of Section 23, Township 27, Range 8 West of the 6th PM. Steve Stelling is owner. The pipe will be used to carry service power to irrigation system. No contractor was listed. Motion by Commission Smith, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve application for underground permit to cross 861st Road. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Pedersen, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- **Access Permit:** The application for access submitted by **Matt Meuret** to place a permit access along 865th Road in the E½NE¼ of Section 33, Township 28, Range 5 West of the 6th PM. Matt Meuret is owner. The access is for access to home. No contractor was listed. Motion by Commission Smith, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve application for access permit to cross 865th Road. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Pedersen, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- **Re-Hire:** Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Smith to accept and approve the rehire of Road and Bridge employee Elijah Pellatz as a full-time employee. Elijah worked for the County in the past and left in good standing. No issues voiced. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Pedersen, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- **Regrading Permits Summerland School:** Brian McDonald approved a temporary approval on the regrading at Summerland School. This was held from March, and a study was completed by Highway Superintendent. Brian recommends a Temporary approval for regrading. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to authorize the temporary regrading at Summerland School. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Pedersen, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- For over a year Antelope County had the access permits for the **TransCanada Project**. During numerous discussions with TransCanada representatives and Antelope County Commissioners and Road Superintendent the permits were reviewed. Casey found eight (8) access permits that paperwork has not been submitted, and presented 56 access permits for approval and 20 permits are recommended to be denied. Casey Dittrich and Aaron Boggs had inspected the sites and recommends approving the 56. Casey is recommending 20 for denial. With these denials there is 7 miles of pipeline that they do not have access or site distance for access on our roads. Their engineer will be busy working up the plan for access permits that we do not have applications for, and an additional 8 underground permits. Commissioner Smith made a motion to put all access/underground permits on hold until TransCanada presents a comprehensive plan in place and a completed application requirement and how they are going to access their pipeline. The motion is not seconded and dies for lack of a second. Discussion on procedures and if the pipeline route changes.
 - **TransCanada Access Permits:** Commissioner Jacob makes a motion to approve 56 temporary access permits as recommend by Road Superintendent/Road Foreman for approval. Motion is seconded by Commissioner Pedersen. Discussion about the possibility of Holt County not approving and where would we be. The access permits are for temporary permits. Voting aye: Jacob, Pedersen, and Henery. Nays Krebs and Smith. Motion carried. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to deny access permits submitted by Keystone Pipeline as suggested by Road Superintendent for lack of site distance. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Pedersen, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
 - **TransCanada Underground Permits:** Road Superintendent and Road Boss presented 37 underground permits and recommended approval. There are an additional eight (8) underground permits needed to fulfill the pipeline underground request. As usual there is a recommendation of 5 feet below lowest point of flow line. Commissioner Smith makes a motion to deny all underground pipe permits. Motion is not seconded, and dies for lack of second. Motion by Commissioner Krebs makes a motion to table the decision of the 37 underground pipeline permits so she can review and research a couple of things as far as five (5) feet below the surface and parameters. Motion is seconded by Commissioner Smith. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Pedersen, Krebs and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- Aaron Boggs, Road Superintendent presented a **resolution regarding rail road crossings** throughout the County. Currently, there are conflicting signage on Rail Road Crossing because of new regulations on these crossings. On NIRMA's recommendation, the resolution is a blanket resolution for all crossings in the County. As of January 31, 2020 NDOR, and the Rail Road has established the Rail Road has jurisdiction of signage in their right of way. This resolution authorizes the County to remove the county signage from the RR right of way. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to approve said resolution. Voting aye: Jacob, Pedersen, Krebs, Smith and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.

attached), recommends that all county owned duplicate/conflicting regulatory signing be removed at said stated locations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Antelope County Board of Commissioners hereby concurs with the attached engineering study and approves the removal of all county owned duplicate/conflicting regulatory signing at railroad grade crossings in Antelope County, see attached location map.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of engineering study and county board resolution be sent by certified mail, return receipt, to BNSF Railroad and Nebraska Department of Transportation Intermodal Planning.

- **Oversize Haul Permit Resolution:** Commissioner Krebs requested to table resolution and propose permit changes. It was discussed if this would be per width, length, etc. the proposed \$100.00 fee would cover the cost of the permit – whether in preparation or in replacing signage after the move. The heavy haul/oversize is for all hauls, including structures, construction hauls, cranes, equipment hauls. We will place this back on the agenda for May. The Commissioners agreed the permit should be for a per haul/load basis, and add any and all engineering fees involved. Verbiage should include ‘the applicant should be responsible for reimbursing the County for any and all damages.’
- **Quote for tractors:** Discussion on need for tractors to work during peak construction season. The County currently owns two (2) tractors and are leasing two (2) tractors. The Commissioners agreed to allow Road Superintendent to pursue a lease agreement with Dinkel. (Dinkel appears to be more affordable than John Deere.)
- **Approved authorizing hiring of Summer help for Road and Bridge.** Aaron is hoping to put together an Asphalt Crew and utilize the Seasonal Help. Utilizing 2-3 seasonal help.
- There was a seven (7) ton weight limit placed on 848th Road (Sargent Road) from Highway 14 to 519th Avenue, according Statute 39-1801. Posted April 9th, 2020. Aaron believes this has slowed traffic.
- **Crumley Access Deed and Acquisition Permit.** The Crumley deeds were signed yesterday afternoon, too late to get on the agenda. The Commissioners conferred with County Attorney regarding the amendment of the agenda for acceptance and approval of the land acquisition. County Attorney did not feel this was not an emergency situation, because nothing will change with the acceptance of the contract, except the County’s ability to access the property immediately. Commissioner Smith motioned seconded by Commissioner Jacob to accept the approve the Acquisition Contract. Voting aye: Jacob, Pedersen, Krebs, Smith and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- **John Prouty Construction:** Asphalt millings are being ground at the Clearwater Barn. Product is nice and has good product in it. It will make great windrow.
- **Asphalt Road Survey:** Casey and Aaron drove every inch of asphalt road. Aaron presented a map with 35 miles of full depth reclamation; 30 miles of hot mix asphalt or patching machine; and 65 miles of good-great shape. The green highlights are part of the active or proposed Road Use Agreements.

Technical Difficulty - (Loss of audio with Zoom Meeting) We did not hear conversation from the Commissioners attending via ZOOM <1 minute)

- Aaron continued with asphalt road discussion. Asking the Commissioners for their recommendation or direction for the future of these roads in Antelope County. Overlaying is approximately \$10,000.00 per inch a mile – the thicker the overlay increases the same (4 inches would be \$40,000.00 a mile.) The hard question of what is the future for the Country regarding the asphalt roads. Are there roads that need to be ground up? Do we grind them and remove the product? Etc. The question of next years budget remaining the same and/or a cut to Road and Bridge budget. Commissioner Pedersen stated she would like to think about this until May meeting. She will discuss this as a one on one with the Road Superintendent.
- Budget discussion. Holding 851 Road, and grinding 849th Road (Escritt Hill) and check with budget next month.

Vendor Claims: The Board Preapproval Report was sent to the Commissioners at 8:00PM on Monday April 13th, 2020. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Smith to approve vendor claims as submitted except Boyd Electrical Services claim of \$10,000.00. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Krebs, Pedersen and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Henery to pay Boyd’s Electrical Claim. Voting aye: Smith, Jacob, Krebs, and Henery. Pedersen abstains. Nays none. Motion carried.
