The Antelope County Board of Commissioners convened in regular (end of the year) session on Tuesday, June 27<sup>th</sup>, 2023, at 9:00 AM in the County Commissioner's Meeting Room, Antelope County Courthouse Annex, Neligh, Nebraska. **Building and Grounds:** Marlene painted door on the west side of the 'old' part of the Courthouse. During previous meetings the Commissioners authorized continued improvements of the courthouse and grounds. To date, Mrs. Schindler has painted the front door on the 'old' courthouse, and it seems to be in good repair. The double door leading to the parking lot does not have supporting structure on the east side of the door frame. After multiple calls to several door companies the majority recommendation was to call Glass Edge. Glass Edge was out and inspected the door and doorway structure. They report that the door structure on the east side is basically non-existent. Glass Edge presented a fix bid for \$8,994.00. This bid will utilize the existing handicap access (however the electrician will be needed to disconnect and reconnect the electronic door). The double doors will be changed to a single-entry wide door. Commissioners voiced no opposition. Security of the building is important. Because there is not sufficient supporting structure to replace it with a like structure the proposal/estimate is to replace with a single 42" door and utilize the existing handicapped automatic door. The bid document is for \$8,994.00. Commissioners agreed with the replacement plan.

Weed Authority: With the passing of Ed Jensen there is a vacancy on the Weed Authority Board. The position was advertised for two (2) weeks, to that avail two (2) applications were submitted. The Commissioners reviewed both applications. Dean Bly and Edmund Schindler were the applicants. Motion by Commissioner Williby, seconded by Commissioner Heithoff to appoint Dean Bly to the Weed Authority Board. Voting aye: Jacob, Heithoff, Williby, and Henery. Nays none. Krebs absent. Motion carried.

**General Fund Function Transfers:** after paying claim on June 13<sup>th</sup>, the functions of 601 – County Board is over budget by \$220.99 and 852 - the Historical function is over budget by 1,200.86 (with the approval of \$414.81 today). The Historical function budget fix was approved in early June. Today, was included to clarify the function transfers. Motion by Commissioner Williby, seconded by Commissioner Heithoff to approve General Function adjustments to balance all functions (\$250.00 to 601 and 2000.00 to 852). Voting aye: Jacob, Heithoff, Williby, and Henery. Nays none. Krebs absent. Motion carried. The Clerk does not have a functioning budget program at this point and will correct when necessary.

**Budget Expenditures/Revenue Adjustments – Commissary to Sheriff General (651):** After approval and payment of claims on June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2023, it was brought to our attention the Commissary Fund had overspent its budgetary authority. After investigating and discussion (and an email to the State Auditor) it was agreed that a journal entry and revenue adjustments would need to be made to balance the Commissary Fund. Motion by Commissioner Heithoff, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve budget adjustments (\$7,820.94-Claim # 23060205) Voting aye: Jacob, Heithoff, Williby, and Henery. Nays none. Krebs absent. Motion carried.

**Petty Cash**: The County Attorney's Office wishes to do away with their petty cash at this time. The money shall be turned over to the Treasurer as per regular dollar placement. The Commissioners acknowledged this action and the removal of the County Attorney petty cash from the audit structure

when it is surrendered. Motion by Commissioner Heithoff, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to acknowledge the transaction. Voting aye: Jacob, Heithoff, Williby, and Henery. Nays none. Krebs absent. Motion carried.

No other issues to discuss.
