
Borrow Pit: Aaron Boggs, while working as Antelope County Road Superintendent had spoken with and gathered an agreement with Gary and Lyn Borer regarding a temporary easement to access and utilization of 4.164 acres of dirt from a borrow pit located in the SW½ of Section 1, Township 23, Range 6, West of the 6th, P.M. Antelope County, Nebraska, for the repairing of roads, structures, and shoulders throughout the area. This area can be used for equipment storage, access to site, and removal of dirt. The agreed upon price is \$1.50 per cubic yard. Yardage to be determined through surveys conducted prior to construction and post consumption. Payments are at the discretion of the landowner. County to replace any fence damage. Discussion of length of availability – Leigh Kluthe, Road Foreman, discussed with the Commissioners he hopes to utilize the borrow bit for this and hopefully next season. County Attorney voiced no issues with the agreement. Motion by Commissioner Williby, seconded by Commissioner Dittrich to approve agreement as presented, and to authorize Chairman to sign same. Voting aye: Williby, Jacob, Dittrich and Henery. Nays none. Krebs was absent. Motion carried.

District 7 Probation: Crystal Hestekind, was recently appointed as direction of the Probation Office and wanted to introduce herself and some of her team to the Commissioners. Ms. Hestekind stated they are about 41 strong when all positions are full. They are currently working on a budget. Antelope County is part of District 7, consisting of the Counties of Antelope, Cumming, Knox, Madison, Pierce, Stanton, Wayne. The team discussed various duties. Their intent was to put faces to the title, as they had not been out to the Counties for a while. No action needed/taken.

Joint Public Hearing: as per usual, Antelope County must determine an agency to print the 'pink postcard' flyer for the County. According to Statute, the joint public hearing is held in September and is intended to allow the public the opportunity to voice regarding budget expenditures and public asking (taxing). NACO has been a huge advocate for a vendor to utilize in getting these published and printed. The Clerk and Assessor were both in favor of partnering with NACO recommendation as they have worked out the details of information to be on the correct color of cardstock. NACO is recommending CSG. CSG is an international corporation specializing in mass printing. They are estimating the cost to be around \$0.50 cents this year. Motion by Commissioner Williby, seconded by Commissioner Dittrich to approve CSG as postcard printer. Voting aye: Williby, Jacob, Dittrich and Henery. Nays none. Krebs was absent. Motion carried.

Road Superintendent Position: With the resigning of Mr. Boggs at the end of last week's meeting, there is currently a vacancy in that position. Discussion today with Road Foreman, Leigh Kluthe regarding expectations and duties. Discussion of leaving all as is and developing a 'lead' type position in every barn. Basically, a point of contact for the road foreman to contact to minimize the number of contacts having to be made on a daily basis. Hoping this keeps the foreman in connection with the employees. Mr. Kluthe asked for some guidance and time to get things established and workable. There is a multitude of ideas and questions within the Road Department. The Commissioners will circle back to this issue in the near future. They requested Mr. Kluthe to keep options open and figure out what is actually needed going forward.

Road Superintendent Report:

- The Road crew is close to completing the patching and are about ready for micro-surfacing. However, because of a scheduling conflict, the contractor is greater than two (2) months out.
- Hotmix Royal Road. Mr. Kluthe indicated the shouldering machine that is being rented this summer is more versatile and runs fluidly in comparison to the paving machine.
- Review of the micro-surfacing projects. Grove Lake Road, Brunswick North, Brunswick South, Old Highway 14, crack sealing various areas.
- Tomorrow or Thursday the crew will be moving to Grove Lake Road.
- 2nd Mile north of school needs to be grounded and relayed.

Road Superintendent Report:

- Oversize Permit: JMS Crane and Rigging submitted two (2) oversize permits to move to Tower #83. The route will be from 519th Avenue @ Tower 67 to 520th Avenue @ Tower 83, via 519th north 836th Road east 520th Road south; in and out. The road foreman recommends approval. - Oversize Permit: JMS Crane and Rigging submitted six (6) oversize permits to move to Wheeler & Holt Counties. The route will be from Tower 96 & 841st Road to Wheeler & Holt Counties @ 846th Road to 516th Avenue (841st Road west 514th Avenue north to 845th Road west). The road foreman recommends approval. - **Equipment status report**: Mr. Kluthe reviewed the Equipment status report. Report of repairs needed or in the process of current fleet. He will continue to gather information on obsolete equipment.
- **NE Nebraska Heating and Cooling**: Mr. Kluthe presented an estimate for a unit in the middle bay of the Tilden Shop. The estimate if for \$3,688.00. This specific unit did NOT work during the winter. Mr. Kluthe reports he will also be putting NE Nebraska Heating and Cooling on a semi-annual basis. There is still an oil heater on the south bay in Tilden.
- **Cross Training**: Mr. Kluthe asked the Commissioners about cross training employees to-from different barns, responsibilities and crews. Commissioners agreed this was an excellent idea.
- **Grader tires**: Antelope County is needing grader tires. At some point this spring tires were 'borrowed' from a grader not in use those also need to be replaced.
- Snow Plows the County is in need of 'V-Plows' for two (2) barns (Elgin-Orchard).
- Used Culverts probably will be setting up used extra culverts for sale to rid extra from yards. Possibly lots of 4-5 and offer to public.
- **Mixing Strip in Clearwater** It was reported the mix strip by the barn in Clearwater could not be used. Mr. Kluthe was looking for some direction. The Commissioners knew no reason why the mix strip could not be used, and authorized use of same.
- **Downed Trees**: over the weekend storms flattened a couple of trees. Mr. Kluthe authorized some employees time to remove debris to help ensure safety for all.
- **Comp Time/Overtime**: The Commissioners agreed that work needed to be completed when it needed to be completed. Compensatory time could be dealt with in more inclement weather times.

It was clarified: the **Road Foreman** will continue operations as usual as he learns the job, projects and figures, or seeks barn leaders. No changes at this time.
