October 10, 2017 Antelope County Board of Commissioners Neligh, Nebraska

The Antelope County Board of Commissioners convened in regular session on Tuesday, October 10, 2017 at 8:00 AM in the County Commissioner's Room, Antelope County Courthouse Annex, Neligh, Nebraska. Meeting was called to order by Chairman Kerkman, with the following board members responding to roll call: Schindler, Jacob, Henery, Schwager, and Kerkman. Chairman Kerkman stated that the open meeting laws are posted on the east wall of the Supervisors' room with more copies available at the County Clerk's Office.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the four county newspapers, legal newspapers printed and in general circulation in Antelope County, Nebraska as shown by proof of publication filed in the County Clerk's office. Since Antelope County implemented the finger touch clocking system, this has become an issue and Connie is requesting guidance on this. Connie, and Bruce Ofe, Antelope County Weed Superintendent met with the Commissioners for direction. After consulting with Joe Abler, Antelope County Attorney, he suggested he will need to study the classification of employees. He suggested she may be classified as a part-time/full-time during the summer months and drop down to part-time in the colder months. However, Connie does not work during the cold months (November – April?), so she really is considered seasonal. County Attorney Abler wanted to investigate this more. No action taken.

These claims are **refunds of tentative inheritance tax** paid by the family of Authur E. Golter. Deb Branstiter, Antelope County Treasurer received this order from District Court. This represents an overpayment and was court ordered by Honorable Donna Taylor to refund the overpayment. Voting aye: Henery, Jacob, Schindler, Schwager and Kerkman. Nays none. Motion carried.

Antelope County Treasurer, Deb Branstiter, met with the Commissioners to review the **Delinquent Tax List**. The list consists of approximately 95 parcels. Although this is a long list the total outstanding debt is \$38,017.61, with the 2015 debt at \$21,506.68. There are just a few more three (3) year delinquent added this year. There was general discussion on a couple parcels including Parcel # 000839400 Ned & Tina Bertschinger this parcel is Improvement on Leased Land (IOLL) on School Land. The had a house on this parcel and something happened and the basically abandoned the property, in the meantime the house has been removed. Other parcels discussed are from last year's delinquent tax list and remain unpaid. However, there are some parcels in which the owners are making a true faith effort to pay the back taxes. The Commissioners appreciated Debs' efforts in collecting these, and requested she continue to work with the public. Motion by Commissioner Henery, seconded by Commissioner Schwager to have Deb discuss the names, parcels and amounts of the three (3) year delinquent tax payers with County Attorney, and to make a recommendation to have the County Attorney send a letter to the new three (3) year delinquent tax payers. Voting aye: Henery, Schwager, Schindler, Jacob and Kerkman. Nays none. Motion passed.

Road Boss Report: Casey met with the Commissioners. Hot off of the email was a letter from the Insurance Company adjuster of the unit that damaged the bridge north of Royal on July 4th, 2017 weekend. They have had the estimate and bridge repair detail for greater than six (6) weeks. Their correspondence referenced our need to replace the whole bridge the will pay the actual cash value of the bridge that was damaged. The bridge has to be repaired as the road is closed and cannot be used at this time, it remains impassable and closed. According to Brian, and his expertise, they cannot expend out the value of labor, the only thing they can expend out would be the materials, which are estimated to be \$2,000.00. Loss of use of the bridge was discussed however nobody knows how to figure this. Casey reported they had been out to the Koinzan Bridge, the bridge is built in a slight hole and Brian suggested an abutment. In order to get a truly smooth transition, Mr. McDonald suggested a 100-foot abutment. Casey *estimated* a 30-foot abutment would be \$12,670, a 60-foot abutment would be \$24,616.00 and the 100-foot abutment would be \$40,500.00 – figuring a square foot price for contract at \$ 9.05. Currently there is a 3 inch drop on the bridge which will be very hard on the wear of the bridge. Motion by Commissioner Schwager, seconded by Commissioner Henry to implement a change order to include a 60-foot abutment on the Koinzan bridge. Listing it as a change order, Klabenes will just do the work while he is out there. Voting aye: Schwager, Henery, Schindler, Jacob and Kerkman. Nays none. Motion carried.

Casey has corresponded with Mitteis Gravel regarding the prepaid **gravel for Willow Township**. Willow Township prepaid for 900 yards of gravel, and the trucking of same. Curt Mitteis has admitted he estimated the trucking high for this Willow Township purchase, and has agreed if Antelope County would pick it up (trucking) he would equivalate this to an additional 700 yards of gravel to pay for the trucking.

Dean Smith had requested on Friday to be on the agenda. However, inadvertently, the county Clerk did not get him added to the agenda. Dean asked about contacts such as NACO or NIRMA who have maybe experienced something like this, that would have some experience or expertise to help on the Bridge north of Royal conundrum. We are keeping in mind the bridge repair deals with the labor aside from materials needed.

Dean presented a copy of an email from Stanton County's Zoning wind regulation approvals. He also referenced the Cherry County Zoning Minutes that was distributed with correspondence. The email was from an individual involved in the process – no name was provided.

Met as **Board of Equalization** for approximately six (6) minutes.

The **notice to proceed** with the re-decking projects on the Clearwater North Bridge and the Neligh Southwest Bridge was presented for Klabenes Construction. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Schwager to accept and authorize chairman to sign the notices. Voting aye: Schwager, Jacob, Schindler, Henery, and Kerkman. Nays none. Motion carried.

Casey presented with the **56 Road Access Permits from Invenergy**. These permits encompass the first portion of the wind tower construction phase. The tower materials will be shipping and arriving in Antelope County this fall, before the end of the year. Currently, they will be unloading this in a central lay down, and Casey presented with the laydown yard access permits. These are approximately 700 and 1200 feet off of Highway 14, there is no culverts to consider. These are located in SW½SW½ 28-26-6. David Shrader owner. Motion by Commissioner Schindler, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve the 2 Access permits for the loading area. Voting aye: Schindler, Jacob, Henery, Schwager and Kerkman. Nays none. Motion carried.

Road Use Agreement: During the October 3rd, 2017 meeting the Road Use Agreement update was discussed. The Road Agreement was updated and approved on May 9, 2017. The agreement has a current list of Roads, and a map showing location. Josh Framel with Invenergy addressed the board and confirmed they would be utilizing this agreement, and asked the Commissioners to grant Casey the authority to manage the road use as needed through the winter months. No further action. Agreement made last week. Josh Framel from Invenergy touched base regarding same. Casey assured the commissioners at any time he would be able to tell them which roads were what.

Liz Doerr, **Zoning Administrato**r gave her regular meeting report. She did not have a lot. Awaiting the Zoning Regulation update meeting at 11:00 AM today. She questioned whether Dean's comments should have been shared. Monthly permit was presented. No further discussion. She is awaiting the start of the Zoning Regulations discussion; Keith Marvin will be here at that time.

Steve Bartz from **Kidwell Inc.** met with the commissioners regarding **IT Services**. Kidwell is out of Lincoln, Nebraska. They have been in business since 1948. They provide special systems such as security, surveillance, access control, telephone systems and electrical contracting, data cabling, and have done IT services since 1992. The contract he presented would be a fully managed proposal it would include malware protections, email and web filtering. The proposal has unlimited hours. Desk top support, firewall, server support, computer networking. It would be a fixed budgeted amount. Any hard ware stuff would be additional however, all software support, computer support, and web would be completed.

Follow-up of the Zoning Regulations Public Hearing continued at 11:00 AM. Keith Marvin, Liz Doerr, and the Commissioners discussed for approximately 70 minutes. During this time discussion ranged on a variety of zoning issues including Livestock Facilities, ANSI standards regarding noise, flicker, ice braking and flooding regulations. Other issues were discussed. Commissioner Henery proposed a motion to accept and approve the Zoning Regulations as presented with the following exceptions and/or deletions:

- Updating the Wind Turbine setbacks to 2400 feet from a non-participating land owner dwelling, with no more than two wind turbines in a 3500-foot radius.
- There will be a 50-decibel noise level limit as measured with a 10-minute Leq. If there is a complaint, follow-up study and cost would be at the complainers' expense.
- Setbacks for ice braking regarding wind turbines will be 1.5 x length of the blade measured from center of the road (or section line).
- Setbacks for other right of ways would be 1.5 x blade length. Rail Road, State & County Roadway Right of Ways.
- Decommissioning plan will remain as current regulations, to include a 180-day timeline to remove the turbines after declaration of inactivity.
- Wind turbine shadow flicker will be removed.
- Add subdivision regulations as written.
- No regulations regarding pipelines.
- Approve and Implement Zoning Map.
- Remove sign regulations.
- Insert language for flood plain appurtenant structure language from the state.

• AGG (also AGT & AGR) Grain bins and Agriculture structures shall meet the setbacks unless there are existing non-conforming agricultural structures with a lesser setback in which case the new structure can go no closer to the property line than the existing structure or 50% of the required setback whichever is greater.

Planning and Zoning Regulation Update

Antelope County, Nebraska RESOLUTION NO. 2017-10-00001

A resolution, consistent with the Comprehensive Development Plan, Adopted for the purpose of promoting health, safety, morals, convenience, order, prosperity, and welfare of the present and future inhabitants of the county of Antelope, Nebraska, to regulate and restrict the location, height, bulk, number of stories, size of buildings and other structures, including tents, cabins, house trailers, and automobile trailers; the percentage of lot areas which may be occupied, building setback lines; size of yards, courts, and other open spaces; the density of population; the uses of buildings; and the uses of the land for agriculture, forestry, recreation, residence, industry, and trade, after considering factors relating to soil conservation, water supply conservation, surface water drainage and removal, or other uses; to divide the County into districts of such number, shape, and area as may be best suited to carry out the purposes of this resolution to regulate, restrict, or prohibit the erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration or use of non-farm buildings or structures, and the use, conditions of use or occupancy of land in the unincorporated areas of the County; to provide for the adoption of a zoning map; to provide for a board of adjustment, its members, powers, and duties; to provide for off-street parking and loading area requirements; to provide for conditional uses by conditional use permit; to provide for non-conforming uses, to provide for the administration and the enforcement of these provisions, and for the violations of its provisions and the prescribed penalties, and including among others such specific purposes as:

Developing both urban and non-urban areas;

Lessening congestion in the streets or roads;

Reducing the waste of excessive amounts of roads;

Securing safety from fire and other dangers;

Lessening or avoiding the hazards to persons and damage to property resulting from the accumulation or run-off of storm or flood waters;

Providing adequate light and air;

Preventing excessive concentration of population and excessive and wasteful scattering of population or settlement;

Promoting such distribution of population, such classification of land uses, and such distribution of land development as will assure adequate provisions for transportation, water flowage, water supply, drainage, sanitation, recreation, soil fertility, food supply, and other public requirements; Protecting the tax base;

Protecting property against blight and depreciation;

Securing economy in governmental expenditures;

Fostering the County's agriculture, recreation, and other industries;

Encouraging the most appropriate use of land in the County; and

Preserving, protecting, and enhancing historic buildings, places, and districts, all in accordance with the comprehensive plan.

WHEREAS Nebraska Revised Reissued Statutes, 1943, Sections 23-114 through 23-114.05 and 23-164 through 23-174.06 as amended, empowers the County to adopt a zoning and subdivision resolution and to provide for its administration, enforcement, and amendment; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Commissioners of the county of Antelope, Nebraska deem it in the interest of the public health, safety, morals, convenience, order, prosperity, and welfare of said County and its present and future residents; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Commissioners of the county of Antelope, Nebraska has adopted a Comprehensive Development Plan pursuant to Neb. R. R. S. 1943, Sections 23-114 through 23-114.03, as amended, and known as Antelope County Comprehensive Plan, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the county of Antelope, Nebraska has recommended the division of the unincorporated areas of the County into districts and recommended regulations pertaining to such districts consistent with the adopted Comprehensive Plan based on a future land use plan designed to lessen congestion on roads and highways, to secure safety from fire, panic and other dangers, to provide adequate light and air, to prevent the overcrowding of land, to avoid undue concentration of population, to conserve agricultural land and values, to facilitate sewerage, schools, parks, and other public needs; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the county of Antelope, Nebraska has given reasonable consideration, among other things, to the prevailing agricultural and rural characteristics now predominant in the County, to the character of the districts and their peculiar suitability for the particular permitted uses, with a reasonable understanding of the objective to conserve the value of lands and improvements while encouraging the development of the most appropriate uses of land throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the county of Antelope, Nebraska has made a preliminary report, held public hearings, submitted its recommended final report to the County Board of Commissioners; and the County Board of Commissioners have given due public notice of hearings relating to the Comprehensive Plan, to the zoning districts, regulations, subdivision regulations, and restrictions, and has held such public hearing; and

WHEREAS, The County Board of Commissioners of the county of Antelope, Nebraska have deemed it necessary to adopt the Comprehensive Plan, the zoning districts, regulations, subdivision regulations, and restrictions for the purpose of the conservation of the existing rural agricultural developments and land uses, of providing for the harmonious development and orderly expansion of urban areas radiating outwardly from existing rural communities, for the orderly extension and planned arrangements of county roads, utilities, for adequate sanitary facilities, for safe and health drinking water, and for reducing flood damage potentials; and

WHEREAS, the requirements of Neb. R.R.S. 1943, Section s 23-114 through 23-124.05, Sections 23-164 through 23-174, and Section 23-174.02, as amended, with regard to the recommendations of the Planning Commission, the Comprehensive Plan, the zoning districts, regulations, subdivision regulations and restrictions and the subsequent action of the County Board of Commissioners have been met;

The approved changes to the draft include, but are not limited to:

- Updating the Wind Turbine setbacks to 2400 feet from a non-participating land owner dwelling, with no more than two wind turbines in a 3500-foot radius.
- There will be a 50-decibel noise level limit as measured with a 10-minute Leq. If there is a complaint, follow-up study and cost would be at the complainers' expense.
 Setbacks for ice braking regarding wind turbines will be 1.5 x length of the blade measured from center of the road (or section line).
- Setbacks for other right of ways would be 1.5 x blade length. Rail Road, State & County Roadway Right of Ways.
 Decommissioning plan will remain as current regulations, to include a 180-day timeline to remove the turbines after declaration of inactivity
- Wind turbine shadow flicker will be removed.
- Add subdivision regulations as written.
- No regulations regarding pipelines.
- Approve and Implement Zoning Map.
- Remove sign regulations.
- Insert language for flood plain appurtenant structure language from the state.
- AGG (also AGT & AGR) Grain bins and Agriculture structures shall meet the setbacks unless there are existing non-conforming agricultural structures with a lesser setback in which case the new structure can go no closer to the property line than the existing structure or 50% of the required setback whichever is greater.
