Motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Jacob to approve underground permit. Voting aye: Jacob, Smith, Krebs, Pedersen and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.
- **Underground permit.** Dan Zwingman submitted an underground permit for placement of an electrical line to supply power for well service for HMP Farms. This is on 520th Avenue in the NE¹/₄ Section 15, Township 23, Range 7, West of the 6th PM, Antelope County,

Nebraska. They will bore beneath the Road at a minimum of 4' as per recommendation. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to approve underground permit. Voting aye: Jacob, Smith, Krebs, Pedersen and Henery. Nays none. Motion carried.

- Access Permit: Brian Smith submitted a permit to install access along 513th Avenue, in the NW¹/₄ Section 33, Township 28, Range 8. 516th Avenue for a field entrance. Aaron will check with Brian about signage. Vision is good. Work to be done according to County and State regulations. Brian is willing to pay for culvert. Motion by Commissioner Jacob, seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to approve upon Aarons inspection and approval. Voting aye: Jacob, Krebs, Pedersen and Henery. Nays none. Smith abstains. Motion carried.
- Oversize Permits: Borsheim Crane Service submitted 2 oversize permits for transfer out. No issues. Motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Krebs to approve. Voting aye: Smith, Krebs, Jacob, Pedersen and Henery.
- **Post Pounder:** Presentation of a hydraulic post pounder. Video was reviewed. 1600 PSI pressure, less than 40 lbs. It is under the threshold for spending, Aaron was presenting for informational purposes only.
- **Gating of 517**th **Avenue Resolution** hold until January.
- **Lighting in Barns**: Aaron and Leigh will be updating lighting in the barns to LED lights. Aaron stated they have converted the Neligh Barn and there is a significant improvement. This is an approximate \$16,000.00 upgrade.
- **Financing on Excavator**: The Board did not desire to finance more equipment at this time. The payment is being made out of Road and Bridge today. No financing will follow.

Partial Release of Thunderhead Road Use Agreement:

- David Owenby, with Invenergy presents with Aaron to release some of the roads back to Antelope County on the Thunderhead Project. Invenergy is looking to release 848th Road (Sargent Road) and 516th Avenue from the Road Use Agreement. There is some patching that needs to be done south of the Clearwater Bridge other than that the Roads are in relatively good condition comparably. With the patching of this area Aaron will probably release these from the RUA.
- 516th Avenue south of Clearwater, 848th Road to Sargent Road, Black Top to 513th Avenue talked about releasing these. They have been patched; armor coated 848th. Issues arising not Invenergy fault. Antelope County will need to look at overlaying north and south of Clearwater with some patching and overlay on 513th Avenue.
- They are looking at releasing 513th Avenue east to Highway 14 and 846th South to Highway 70. Road Superintendent and Mr. Dittrich have driven this area.
- Not released are the following Upgrade Roads:

- Since right of way on 841st was not abandoned/closed this will probably be an upgrade road. So 841st Road from the County Line to 514th Avenue will not be released.
- 514th Avenue from Highway 70 to 841st Road
- 846th open to substation to County Line
- o Brian McDonald, Casey Dittrich, Matt Klabenes, David Owenby and Aaron drove the upgrade roads last week. Invenergy was given a punch list of things to do. Invenergy will work on these this month and possibly present for release next month.
- o If there are issues that appear on these roads Invenergy is willing to help with these issues.
- Aaron and Casey both expressed comfort of releasing the roads at this time. Aaron stated he thought Invenergy went above and beyond on this project. The project had some snags, but it came around.

Antelope County Board of Commissioners Resolution Partial Release Road Use Agreement – Thunderhead Exhibit A 2020-12-0001

WHEREAS, the Antelope County entered into a Road Use Agreement during the Construction and development of the Thunderhead Wind Farm Project; and

WHEREAS, the Antelope County Road Superintendent, and the county engineer, has performed a post-construction survey of said Agreement Roads and, in accordance with the County Roads Use Agreement (the "County Roads Use Agreement"), between Antelope County and Invenergy, the Developer, as defined therein, Developer has maintained and restored County roads to the as-found condition or better for the County roads identified on the attached Exhibit A. The County roads listed on Exhibit A were reviewed jointly with representatives of Developer and the County and were confirmed to meet or exceed the as found condition. Accordingly, upon approval of this Resolution by the County Board, the responsibility for maintenance of these roads will revert to and shall become the responsibility of Antelope County, and except for the conditions stated herein, all obligations of the Developer pursuant to the County Roads Use Agreement will terminate for County roads listed on Exhibit A. County roads which are not yet complete will continue be the responsibility of Developer until such time as they meet all requirements for the design of roads being upgraded and/or road condition meets or exceeds the as-found condition of the roads.

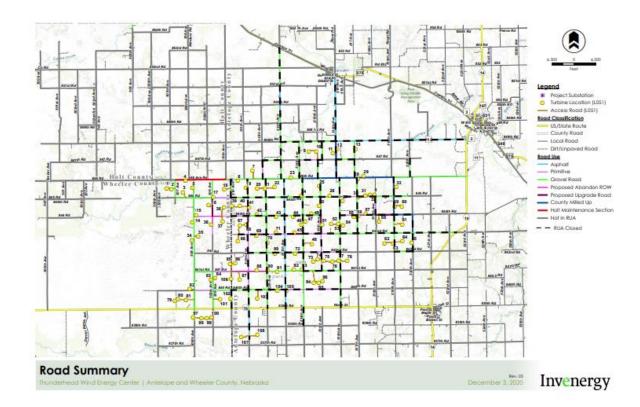
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Antelope County accepts responsibility for road maintenance as shown on the attached Exhibit A with the following conditions:

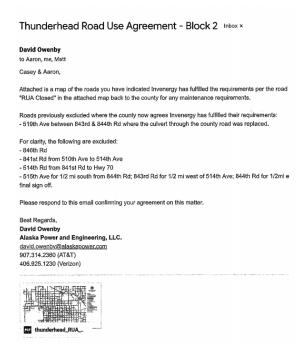
Bridges utilized in the performance of the Work and included in the County Roads Use Agreement will be inspected by the County Engineer. Any damage noted and attributed to the Work will continue to be the responsibility of the Developer.

Re-vegetation of road ditches and County right of way property remain the responsibility of Developer until such time as greater than 70% coverage is achieved with a seed mix acceptable to the County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that except for the conditions stated above, all obligations of the Developer pursuant to the County Road Use Agreement are hereby terminated for County roads listed on Exhibit A.

In November, a list was shared with Commissary pricing. Today, Sheriff presents with a resolution setting these prices. Discussion. State Wide Radio Bid: Sheriff Moore presented today with information regarding the State Wide Radio Bid. This is the system that connects Antelope County communications with other dispatch centers and the State Patrol. It will work in tandem with the current inter county fire and rescue systems. Platte Valley Communications has presented a bid of \$98,477.15 for upgrade of the Dispatch Center and equipping of five (5) units. In an effort to defray costs for Antelope County, Sheriff Moore has worked with TransCanada to get a donation. Today, Sheriff Moore deposited a check to the Antelope County Treasurer for \$85,000.00 which was a direct donation from TransCanada to defray the costs of the update and to improve communications in the area and with other law enforcement teams. With a balance of a little less than \$13,500.00 Sheriff plans to expend out of the 2940 – Law Enforcement Account. Motion by Commissioner Krebs, seconded by Commissioner Pedersen to accept the bid from Platte Valley Communications, as so to proceed with the communication bridge. Voting aye: Krebs, Pedersen, Jacob and Henery. Nays Smith. Motion passed.

In follow up of the discussion of **Master Controls** bid from last spring to update the Dispatch Center. Sheriff Moore reported the work has begun. To help facilitate this installation there are wires that need to be pulled, some wiring changes and counter top additions to the dispatch center. He was informing in a heads up these expenses will be coming. The Master Control update is to upgrade communications with the Western Region on 9-1-1. These expenses will come out of the 2940 Account.
